

Environmental Policy Statement

CBA's Environmental Management System (EMS) was certified to ISO 14001:2004 in September 2012 and re-certified in September 2015. The EMS was certified to ISO 14001:2015 in May 2018.

CBA is one of the leading environmental planning and landscape design consultancies in the UK, and environmental sustainability has continued to be central to the company's professional culture and values for over 40 years. CBA is committed to protection of the environment in terms of its own environmental performance and the wider sustainability agenda.

CBA is committed to continuous review and improvement of the EMS, and to meeting its compliance obligations with respect to statutory, regulatory and other requirements relating to the company's significant environmental aspects in line with the company's aims to:

- Improve business productivity and consolidate CBA's position as a leading environmental planning and landscape design consultancy.
- Adopt a practical approach to greater integration of quality, environmental and health and safety risk management proportionate to the company's professional activities.
- Deliver continual improvement and prevent pollution through on-going review and implementation of effective project management, technical production systems and office management.

CBA's environmental management objectives are to:

1. Reduce business travel through teleconferencing, making use of public transport links and by encouraging and facilitating sustainable travel behaviour among employees wherever possible.
2. Encourage and facilitate resource efficiency in the workplace through pro-active management of energy and water use, and waste reduction measures.
3. Ensure that office supplies are procured from sustainable sources where possible, and recycled and/or disposed of in accordance with regulatory requirements.
4. Raise awareness of CBA's commitment to environmental sustainability through communication of this Policy Statement as part of all contractual arrangements with third parties.
5. Raise awareness and, where possible, address the environmental impact of the design and specification of materials procured in relation to delivery of CBA client projects through implementation of best practice environmental sustainability principles.

Progress against these aims will be regularly monitored at Board level.
